### Why have an MSRA Brain Bank?

Neurologists and Neuroscientists from around Australia agree the MSRA Brain Bank is vital to finding answers – a cause and a cure – for MS. The MSRA Brain Bank will be an MS-specific collection which will provide tissue to scientists for MS research. Scientists need human brain and other tissue, from people with and without MS, to fully understand what causes the disease. This will lead to knowledge about how to stop it.

Recent studies show that MS research based on animal models does not accurately replicate MS as it occurs in humans. This probably explains why despite improvements in treatment, we still do not have a cure for MS. The research that pointed to the limitations of the animal studies of MS was done using human brain tissue.

Research on brain tissue is already done in Australia. Brain Bank programs have advanced our understanding of Parkinson's disease and Alzheimer's disease. The results for MS will be similarly successful and thousands of Australians and their families will benefit.

### What is a Brain Bank?

A brain bank is a collection of brain tissue – often including other tissue such as the spinal cord – from the bodies of donors who have died. The brain is removed and stored using special techniques to optimise the research possibilities. The removal of tissue must be performed rapidly after death. The tissue will be available to researchers worldwide.

### Who runs the brain bank?

Professor Simon Hawke is the Director of the MSRA Brain Bank. The MSRA Brain Bank is a subsidiary bank that works with the Australian Brain Bank Network directed by Professor Catriona McLean who is responsible for the collection and storage of tissue nationally.

Professor Hawke is a Neurologist with a strong MS research interest and experience operating the UK MS Tissue Bank. Professor Hawke also chairs the MSRA Brain Bank's Advisory Board that includes a Neuropathologist, a researcher using the tissue, a person with MS, and a representative from MSRA and the MS Society.



# What measures ensure privacy and appropriate care of the tissue?

The MSRA Brain Bank must comply with the university and hospital ethics committees. Any donor information will be recorded so the patient cannot be identified, for example by using codes instead of names. This and other information will be protected by passwords and stored in computers and files in secure offices. It will only be accessed for research purposes.

### How can I help?

It's neither too early nor too late to consider it: younger or older people with MS are encouraged to register as donors regardless of whether they might die prematurely or from natural causes later in life. People with MS can help by enrolling to donate their brain and other tissues. Donations of money are also most welcome to help maintain this expensive but vital project.

To achieve breakthroughs, researchers need access to human tissue from people with and without MS.
